Start placing lunch orders! You can place orders up to 4 weeks in advance.

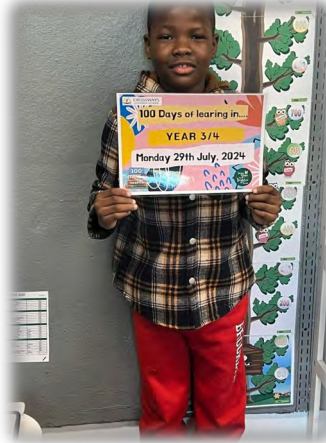

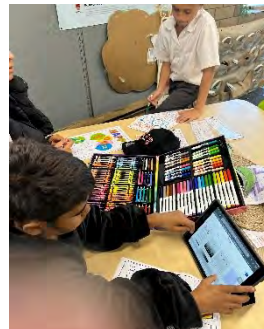
In science this term we are studying Chemistry and looking at States of matter, students conducted their first experiment for the term with Miss Hayley:

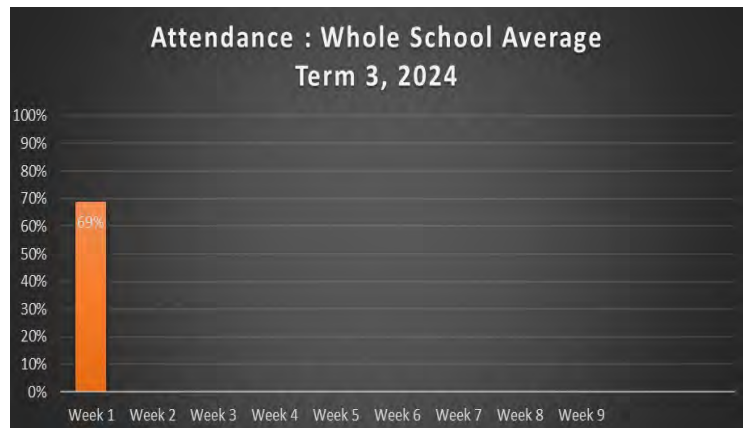
